- 3. Turn right onto FL-559 S about 1 min
- 4. Slight right to merge onto I-4 W about 34 mins
- 5. Take exit 9 to merge onto I-75 N toward Ocala about 14 mins
- 6. Take exit 275 for FL-56 W go 0.4 mi total 51.5 mi

Shopping List

Three rolls of paper towels per patrol, scrub pads, dish soap, 3 boxes of Ritz crackers, Cheese (American) 3 blocks, Pepperoni 3 bags, pre-cooked sausage 3 packs, 5 bags of bagels, 1 lg. tub of cream cheese. For the foil packs you will need 2 rolls aluminum foil, 2 pkg. carrots, 2 medium onions, 1 celery stalk, salt and pepper (if not already in the patrol boxes), 5 lbs. (1/4 lb. for each scout) ground beef. For anyone who does not want ground beef, we can buy some chicken breasts, (maybe a pkg of 4-5 ea). For s'mores, we will need graham crackers (3 boxes, marshmallows 2 bags large, and chocolate bars. Figure one chocolate bar for each scout. For Sunday breakfast we will need 2 boxes of any low-sugar cereal. i.e. Honey nut cheerios, low sugar fruit loops, low sugar frosted flakes........also, we will need 1 gal. OJ and 2 gals of low-fat milk.

Think about what it will take to fix your meals; do you need oil, margarine, flour, milk, spice, zip-lock bags, special equipment?

Assistant Cook: Wash hands, assist cook as requested, help with cleanup and dishes.

Fires Work with all fire individuals in other patrols to maintain fire ring by filling fire buckets, clean, shovel and rake fire pit area, gather and stack a generous supply of firewood as needed.

Dishess Wash all dishes, pots and pans used in cooking. Cook and Assistant Cook will help you.

\$ite Cleanup: Work with all site cleanup individuals in other patrols to clean up the latrine and campsite area.

BOY SCOUTS AMERICAN HERITAGE BADGE

PRE-REQUISITES TO EARN AMERICAN HERITAGE MERIT BADGE

- 1. Scouts should read the Declaration of Independence (copy attached). Pay close attention to the following section and jot down some ideas on how it could be re-written to be more understandable.
- A. We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. That to secure these rights, governments are instituted among men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed. That whenever any form of government becomes destructive to these ends, it is the right of the people to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their safety and happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shown that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such government, and to provide new guards for their future security.
- 2. Research your family's history. Find out how events and situations in American history affected your family. Tell why your family came to America.

Marine Families of Polk County will be here onsite to share with the scouts what an honor it is to <u>give</u> <u>back</u> to our enlisted troops and their families. This organization provides military personnel, their families and retired veterans with emotional and program support.

One of their most recognized programs, Bath in a Box, are bathing kits that are sent to our military personnel around the world that do not have access to showers and ways to stay clean....and reminds them that as Americans we appreciate what they are doing for our country.

Scouts are not required, but are encouraged to bring one (1) of the following items to help build these boxes:

- Ziploc Bags (box)
- Scrubby
- Toilet Paper (4 pack)
- Bottled water (gallon jug)
- 33-gallon black garbage bag (box)
- Bar of soap or body wash
- Small bottles of shampoo
