- 1. Start out going south on Little Rd toward St Lawrence Dr. 0.5 mi
- 2. Turn right onto Old County Road 54. 1.1 mi
- 3. Turn right onto SR-54 W. 3.3 mi
- 4 Turn left onto US-19 6.5 mi
- 5. Turn right onto Klosterman Rd E/E Klosterman Rd. 1.3 mi

Klosterman Rd E is 0.3 miles past Sun Valley Blvd HESS 09560 is on the corner If you reach Rita Ln you've gone about 0.2 miles too far

6. Turn slight left onto US-19-ALT/Palm Harbor Blvd. 0.9 mi US-19-ALT is 0.1 miles past Carolina Ave

Subway is on the corner

7. Turn right onto Harry St (Portions unpaved). 0.1

Harry St is just past Progress Ct If you reach Dunn Dr. you've gone about 0.2 miles too far

History:

The property in and around "Wall Springs" was purchased by Charles F. Wall on February 28, 1884 and remained in his family until May 17, 1927 when the property was sold to Harry W. Davis.

The spring became known as "Wall Springs" during ownership by the Wall family. Once the property was sold to the Davis family the spring became known as "Health Springs" and was used as a health spa. When the property was purchased by the Cullen Family on February 6, 1948 the spring name changed back to "Wall Springs" and the area was used as a recreational area until the mid - 1960's.

The spring and adjoining pond were used as a spa & bathing area from the turn of the 20th century until the mid 1960's.

Pinellas County began acquiring the Wall Springs property in 1988, with the initial purchase of approximately 63 acres which included the spring and surrounding area.

Pinellas County has continued to

acquire additional property since their initial purchase with the most recent acquisitions having been made in December 2008 and April, 2009. Wall Springs is now approximately 210 acres in total size.



Facts & Information on the Spring:

- The source of the spring is the Upper Floridian Aguifer
- The flow varies from zero during drought to a high of 7,405 gallons per minute
- During periods of high rainfall as much as 10.7 million gallons of water can flow from the spring in 1 day
- However, the average water flow is 2,917 gallons per minute or about 4.2 million gallons per day
- The spring water temperature remains at a nearly constant 74 degrees
- Swimming is not allowed in the spring because of the danger to the ecosystem.
