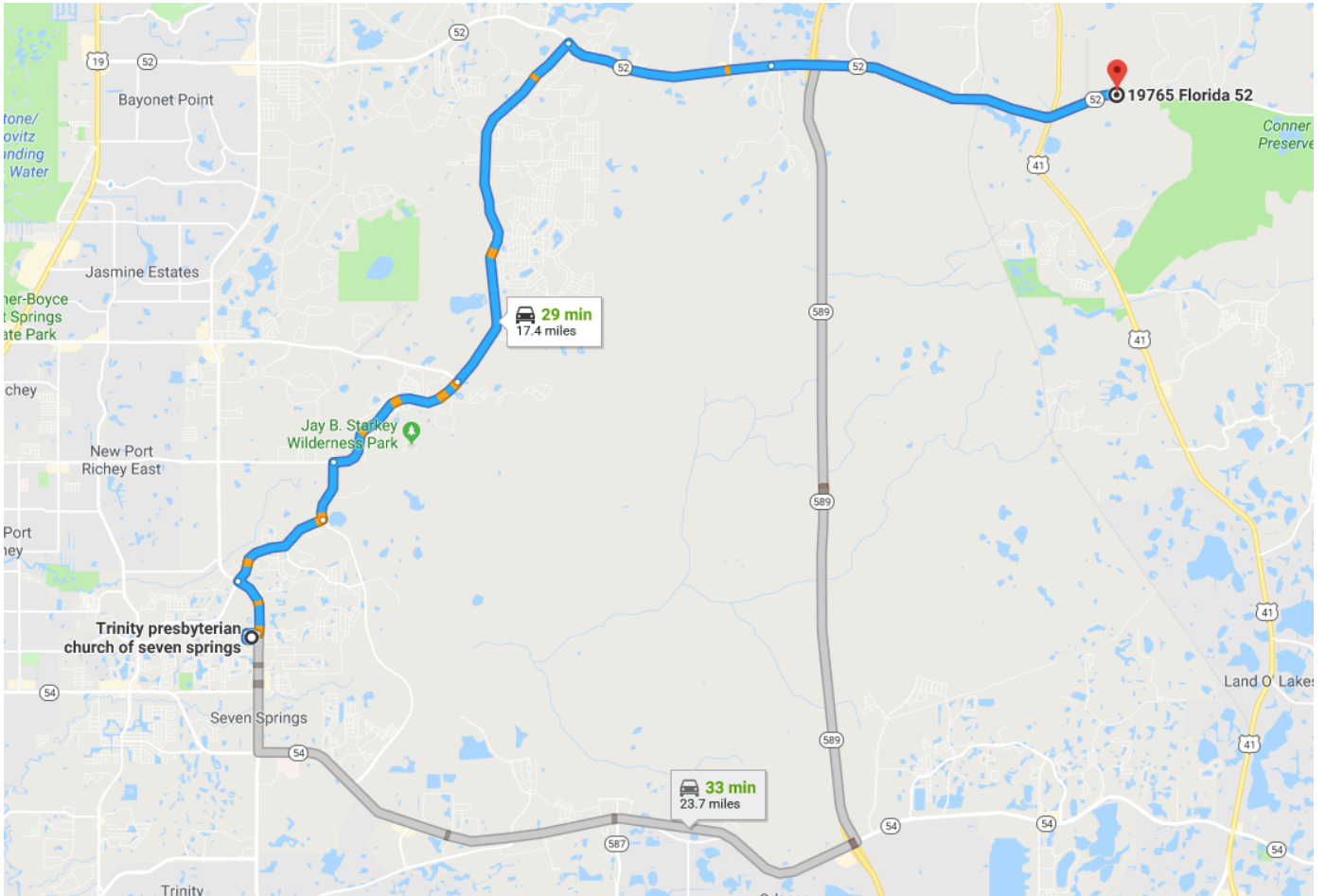

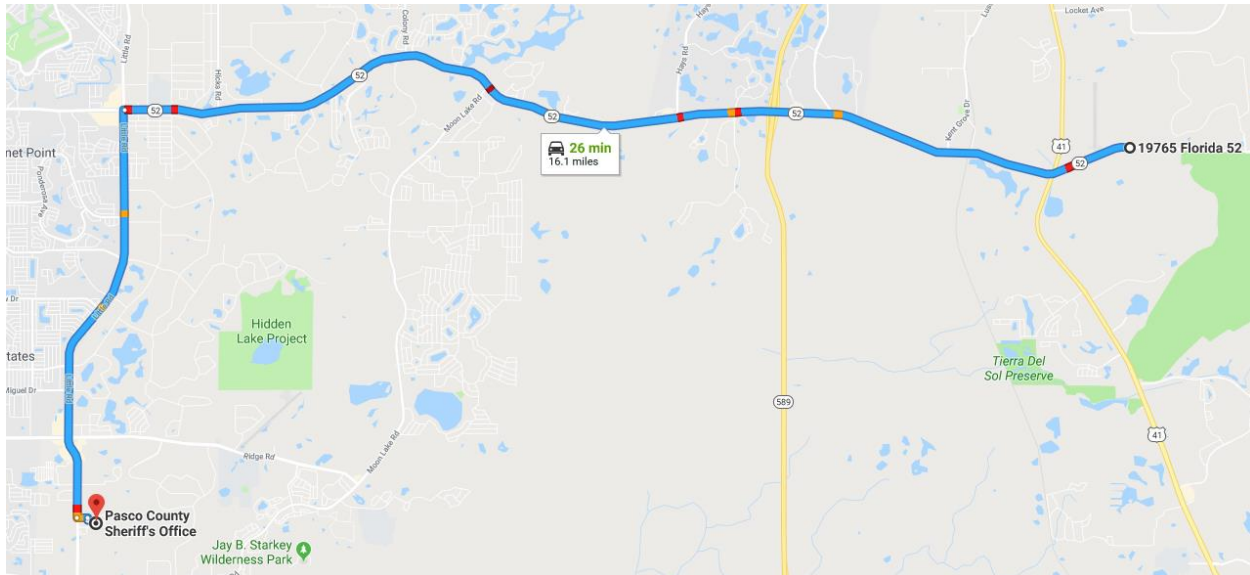

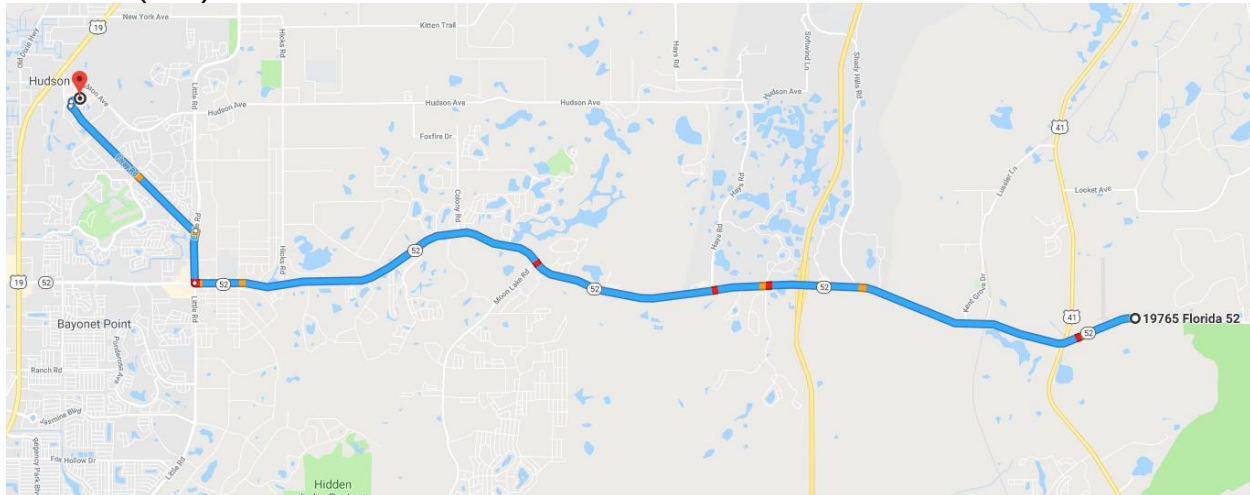

Additional Covid info:

One person per tent at all times (unless family). Generally, try to social distance. If talking in a group, try to keep a large enough circle (spread out 6' or more).

When cooking, only cooks near the food. When being served, one scout at a time. When eating, sit spaced out around the campsite.

For this campout, as scouts will be picked up by parents directly from the ranch, quartermaster should be ready to assign gear to scout before they depart.

CONDITIONS TO BE AWARE OF:

- Sitting on a horse is just sitting right? Not really. There's a huge difference between being a rider and being a passenger. Staying on and controlling a horse requires the same sort of body control that many other sports require—like ballroom dancing, martial arts, downhill skiing and others.
