SHOTGUN SHOOTING STANCE

- 1 Lean forward, this enables you to control recoil, even after numerous shots
- 2 Cheek weld. Align your eyes with the sight of the shotgun by keeping your cheek in tight to the stock
- 3 Pull the gun firmly to the shoulder. If it is loose, the stock will hit your shoulder shot after shot
- 4 Flex your knees for a better recoil management
- 5 Keep your elbows tucked in for a low profile and better support of the shotgun
- 6 Feet shoulder width apart for a more stable stance
- 7 Hold the forend firmly. Use your thumb and forefinger fingers to create a "V"

TENT ASSIGNMENTS: -

DURING COVID, BROTHERS CAN TENT TOGETHER. EVERYONE ELSE WILL NEED TO TENT ALONE.

If weather is nice, scouts can also sleep under the stars / in hammocks.

CONDITIONS TO BE AWARE OF:

- **All** – Fires must be in designated fire pits only.
- **HYDRATION**- Remember to drink plenty of water throughout the day.
- **DO NOT** approach, touch, or feed any of the wildlife. It is against the law.
- **March** is typically can be **rainy** in FL, warm in the day and cool at night. Remember this when packing.
- **BUGS** – Bring bug spray, mosquito net if sensitive to insect bites.

ALWAYS

**keep the gun pointed
in a safe direction.**



ALWAYS

**keep your finger off the
trigger until ready to shoot.**



ALWAYS

**keep the gun unloaded
until ready to use.**

When Using or Storing a Gun, Always Follow These NRA Rules:

- Know your target and what is beyond.
- Be sure the gun is safe to operate.
- Wear eye and ear protection as appropriate.
- Store guns so they are not accessible to unauthorized persons.
- Know how to use the gun safely.
- Use only the correct ammunition for your gun.
- Never use alcohol or drugs before or while shooting.
- Be aware that certain types of guns and many shooting activities require additional safety precautions.

FIREARMS, OR AMMO TO SANDHILL CAMPGROUNDS.**

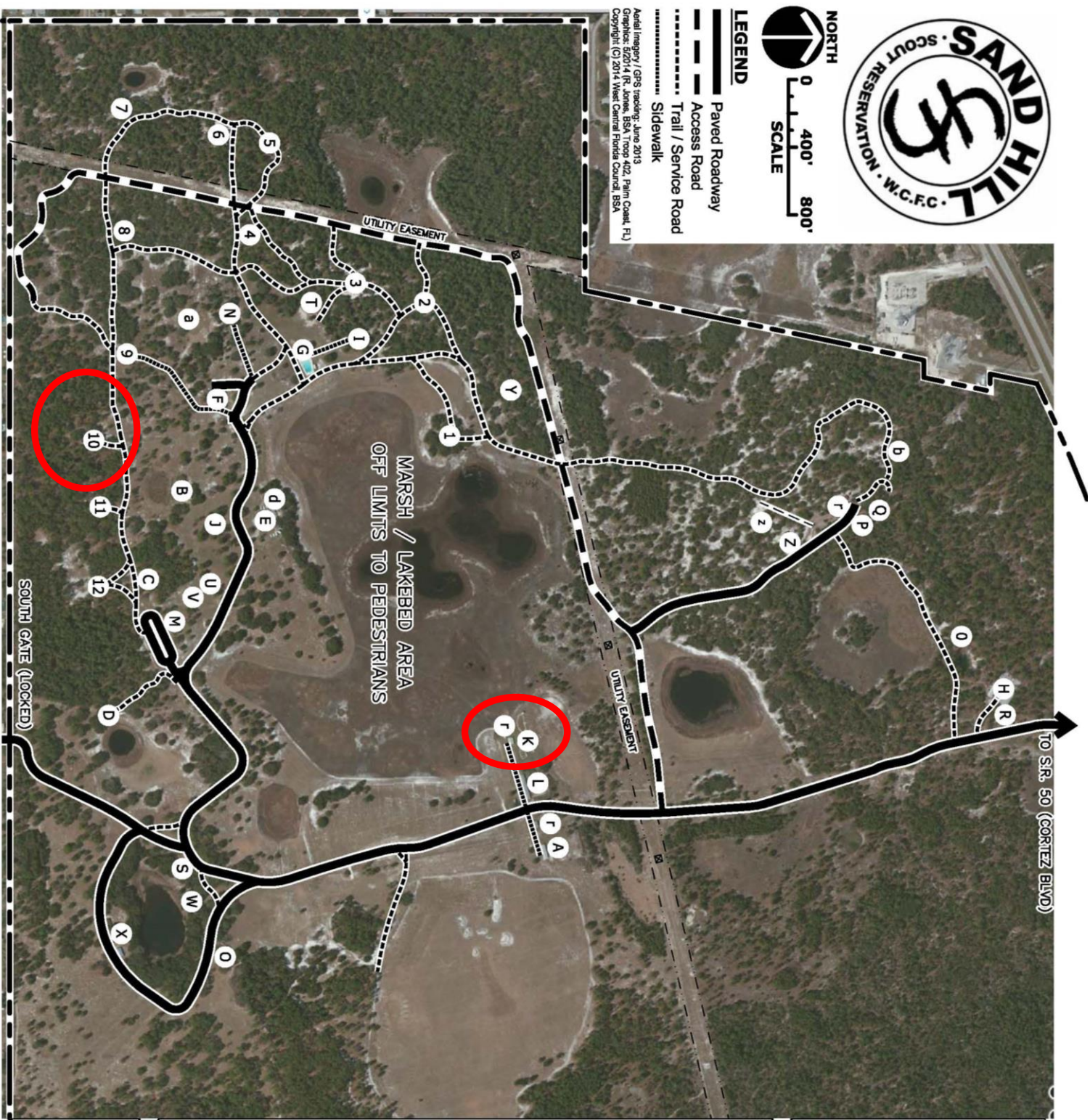
