TENT ASSIGNMENTS:

- SCOUTS MAY BRING THEIR OWN TENT, OUR USE TROOP TENTS AS AVAILABLE.
Scouts borrowing tents may need to double up.
No more than 2 years (720 calendar days) between tent buddies.
Hammocking should be possible.

Those Working on Wilderness Survival will need to make their shelter Saturday and sleep in it Saturday night.

CONDITIONS TO BE AWARE OF:

- ○ **FIRE** – Fire must be in fire pit. No collecting of wood. Must bring in.
- ○ **HYDRATION** - Remember to drink plenty of water throughout the day.
- ○ **DO NOT** approach, touch, or feed any of the wildlife. It is against the law.
- ○ **BUGS** – Bring bug spray, mosquito net if sensitive to insect bites.
- ○ **BATHROOMS** – Bathrooms and Showers are available in the campsite area.
- ○ **WAVES** – This is the Atlantic. Waves can be strong and knock you over.
- ○ **RIP CURRENTS** – Understand and know how to deal with Rip Currents.(see last page)

Hours

- The park is open 8 a.m. to sunset daily.
- The ranger station is open 10:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.
- The fort is open 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily.
- The visitor center is open 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily.
- Campsite Check in is 3pm.

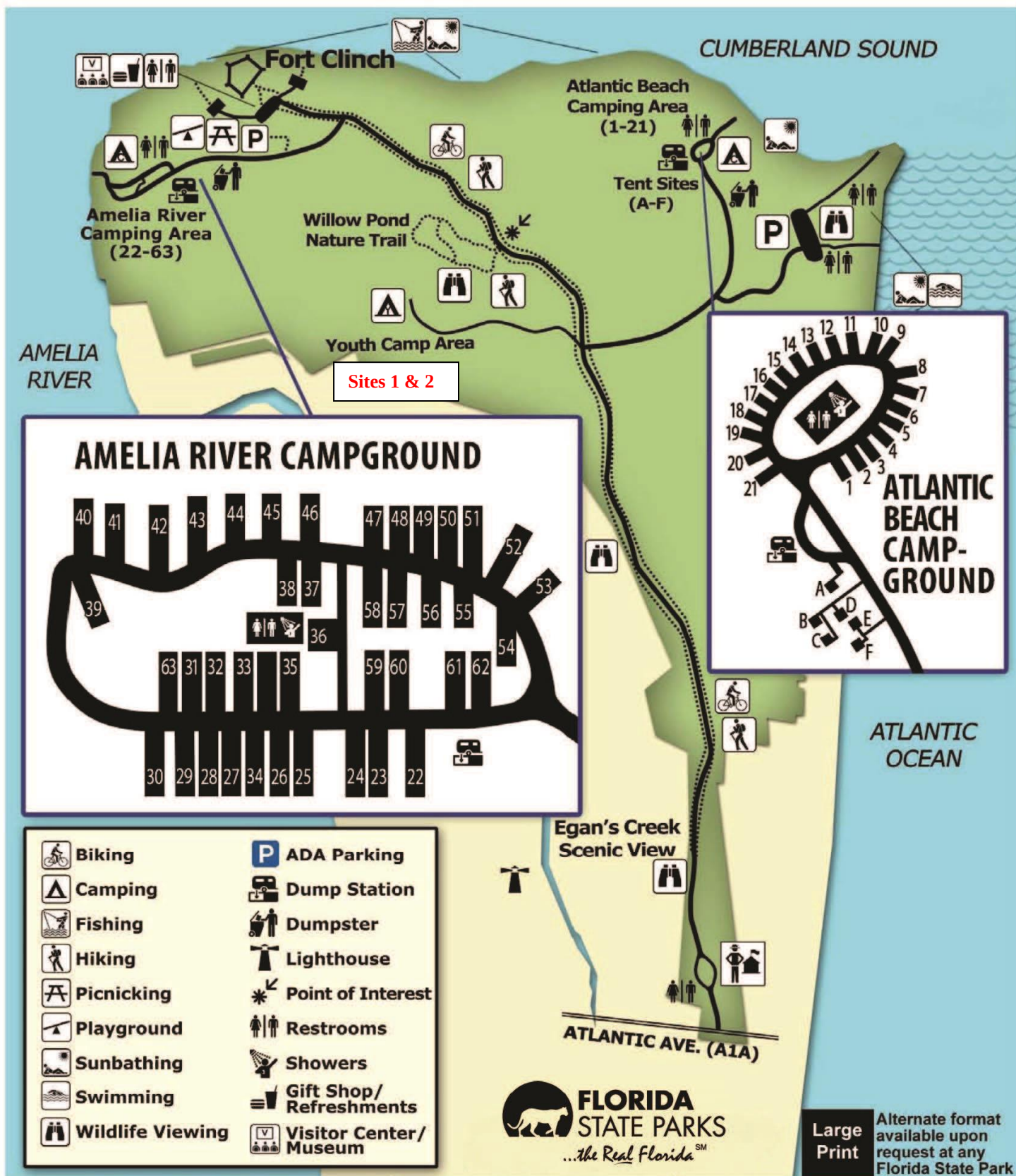

General Park Information

- Washers, dryers are located at each campground restroom.
- Visitor Center offers a wide variety of snacks, refreshments, ice, firewood, bait, tackle, educational books, ice cream, coffee, camping supplies & more.
- Place trash & recyclables in dumpster area provided near campground exits. Trash cans in restroom are for paper trash only.

Park Rules

For your safety & protection, all rules in 62-D-2 (FAC) are enforced.

- Check-out time 1pm. Check-in time 3pm.
- **Quiet time** 11pm - 7am. Noise can not carry beyond the borders of the campsite (pet noise, music, etc).
- **Alcoholic beverages** prohibited outside of campsite.
- **All plants & animals protected.** Do not feed or harass wildlife. Do not cut, nail, tie or hang anything to trees.
- **Climbing on sand dunes is strictly prohibited.**
- **Speed limit enforced.** Watch for bikes and pedestrians.
- **Fires in grills only.** Collecting firewood is prohibited (live or dead limbs, branches, log, etc.). Firewood is for sale at Entrance Station & Visitor Center.
- **Use of metal detectors & digging is prohibited.**
- **Fireworks and hunting prohibited.**
- **Fishing** requires Florida fishing license.
- **Sewage & gray water** must be disposed at dump station.
- **Florida law requires children under 16 wear bike helmet**
- **Maximum campsite occupancy is 8 people & 2 vehicles.** Camping gear & vehicles must fit on the campsite, not to project into natural areas, park road or other sites. Contact Ranger for overflow parking areas.
- **Daily visitors to campsites** must pay a park entry fee.
- **Smoking & pets** are prohibited in all facilities & restrooms.
- **Vehicle washing/repairs** are not permitted on the site.
- **Children under 18 must be chaperoned by an adult.**
- Boats are not permitted to beach along park shoreline.

Pet Rules

- Service Animals are welcome in all areas of the park.
- Pets **are permitted** in camping areas, nature and hiking trails, picnic areas & along park drive. Pets are **not allowed** on beaches, in buildings, boardwalks or in Fort.
- Pets must be well behaved, confined, leashed or under the physical control of the owner at all times.
- Leashes may not exceed 6 feet in length.
- Pets shall not be left unattended longer than 30 minutes.
- Pets must be confined in the campers unit during quiet hours (11pm-7am).
- Pet owners must pick up after pets and dispose of waste.
- Any pet that is noisy, dangerous, intimidating, or destructive will not be allowed to remain in the park.

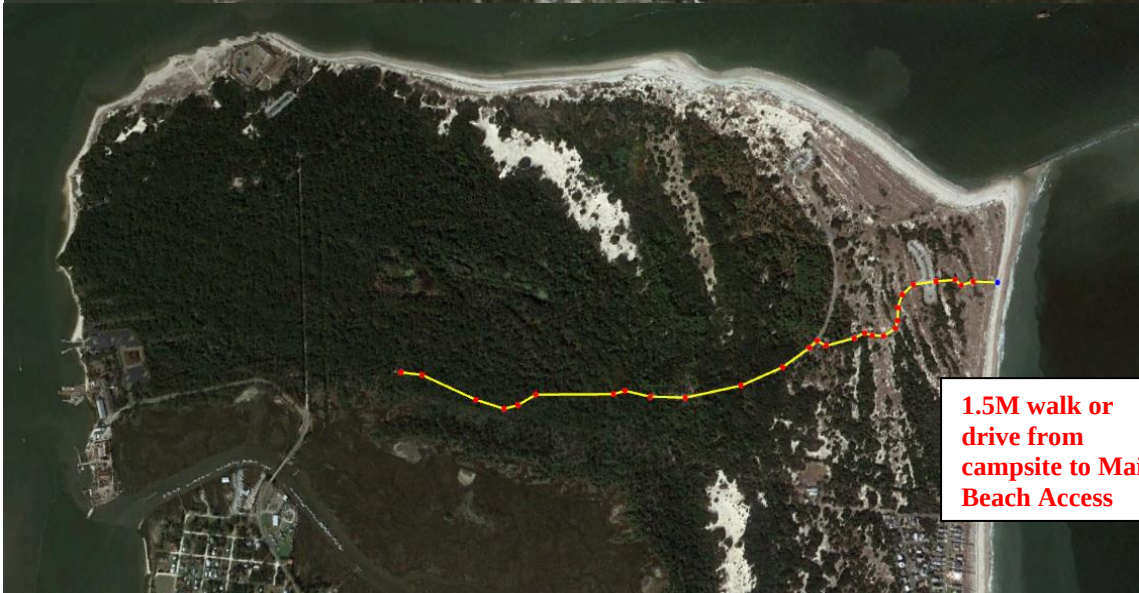
Failure to follow pet rules will result in the camper removing the pet from the park or checkout of the site.

Golf Carts & Utility Vehicle's (UTV's)

- May only be driven on park roads. They may **not** be driven on boardwalks, nature or biking/hiking trails, beaches or off roadways.
- Operators must have a valid driver's license. **All Florida traffic laws & local ordinances apply & are enforced.**
- Required Equipment: working brakes, dependable steering, safe tires, rear view mirror, red front & rear reflection.
- May only be driven at night if equipped with headlights, brake lights, turn signals & windshield.

(2 mile drive)**



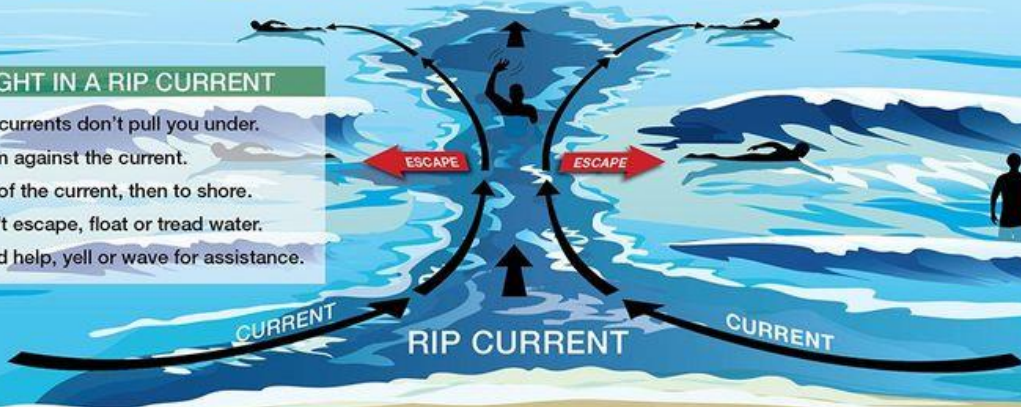
**1.5M walk or

RIP CURRENTS

KNOW YOUR OPTIONS

IF CAUGHT IN A RIP CURRENT

- Relax, rip currents don't pull you under.
- Don't swim against the current.
- Swim out of the current, then to shore.
- If you can't escape, float or tread water.
- If you need help, yell or wave for assistance.



Rip currents are powerful currents of water moving away from shore. They can sweep even the strongest swimmer away from shore. If at all possible, swim near a lifeguard.

SATURDAY...Surf height 1 to 2 feet. Southwest winds around 10 mph.

SUNDAY...Surf height 1 to 2 feet. South winds around 10 mph.

Current Risk Category

* Moderate Risk - Life-threatening rip currents are possible in the surf zone.
