Licenses and permits are available online at GoOutdoorsFlorida.com, in person at a license agent or tax collector's office or by calling toll-free **888-FISH-FLORIDA** (888-347-4356). You can also download the "Fish / Hunt FL" app and purchase licenses through it. The Digital License is always with you on the app.

Fishing Licenses are required for anyone over 16 except: State residents who are age 65 years and over and residents and non-residents who are under 16 years of age do not need a license to fish.

- Ocean Rules
  - Life Jackets <u>MUST</u> be worn on <u>ANY</u> Watercraft. This is BSA Policy.
  - Life Jackets <u>MUST</u> be worn if you have not passed the BSA Swim Test. This is BSA Policy.
  - You are <u>NOT</u> permitted to touch, feed, molest or ride any wildlife.
  - o All FWC guidelines must be followed with regards to fishing/wildlife
- Note: There is 1 outhouse on the island with a composting toilet. We will bring a second tented outhouse with a bucket, toilet seat, and BioBags.






The average water temperature in North Anclote Key will be 76°F.

Fish Species	Best Times to Fish in Tarpon Springs	
King Mackerel	Available year-round; summer until early September is the best time.	
Redfish	Available year-round; April until early September is the best time.	
Grouper	June through October is the best fishing season for grouper.	
Permit	Summer is the best season with mornings being especially good.


# Real Fun in ... the Real Florida

Welcome to Anclote Key Preserve State Park where nature meets serenity. Located three miles off the coast from Tarpon Springs, this state park is an island-lover's paradise. Whether it's an **angler** searching for seatrout or a family looking for some fun in the sun, Anclote Key is their destination.

Anclote Key Preserve State Park is comprised of four islands – Anclote Key, North Anclote Bar, South Anclote Bar and Three Rooker Island. Rest and relaxation are two major pastimes at this park. Visitors can bring beach chairs, umbrellas and coolers to this coastal haven and relax for a day or two on a mini tropical retreat. These islands are prime spots for reeling in seatrout, tarpon and snook.

A primitive camping area is located on the northern tip of Anclote Key. Visitors will find grills, picnic tables, a pavilion and a composting toilet. Please note that there are no garbage receptacles on the island. Visitors must take out what they bring in! Temperatures can soar in the hot Florida sun, so visitors should be sure to bring drinking water as there is no fresh water available on the island.

This is a great place for **bird watching**. Binoculars enable a close-up view of eagles nesting in the pine trees and ospreys searching the water for fish. Wading birds such as egrets, herons and roseate spoonbills, fish in the seagrass beds and mudflats on the bay side of the islands creating vivid photo opportunities. Three-Rooker Island attracts great numbers of gulls, terns and black skimmers.
